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
### **Heatherslaw Circular** **via Errol Hut**


**Distance:** 2 Miles (approx)  
**Grade:** Easy with some climbs

*Suggested donation for this leaflet 20p*

**Follow the directions below in conjunction with the map overleaf and the colour coded way-markers along the route (as shown above)**

- A. Start/finish at the car park beside Heatherslaw Railway.
- B. Cross the road and go through the small gate. Follow the path to the top of the hill where you will see a fingerpost.
- C. Turn left at the finger post and continue straight ahead past the Timber Yard, to Errol Hut Smithy.
- D. Turn left down the road.
- E. At the bottom of the hill cross the road and follow the Route 68 cycle path back to Heatherslaw.
