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## **Heatherslaw Circular**

**Distance:** 3+ Miles  
**Grade:** Easy

*Suggested donation for this leaflet 20p*

**Follow the directions below in conjunction with the map overleaf & the colour coded way-markers along the route (as shown above)**

A. Start/Finish at Heatherslaw Visitor Centre. Turn right out of Visitor Centre and follow the road past the farm and cottages to T-junction.

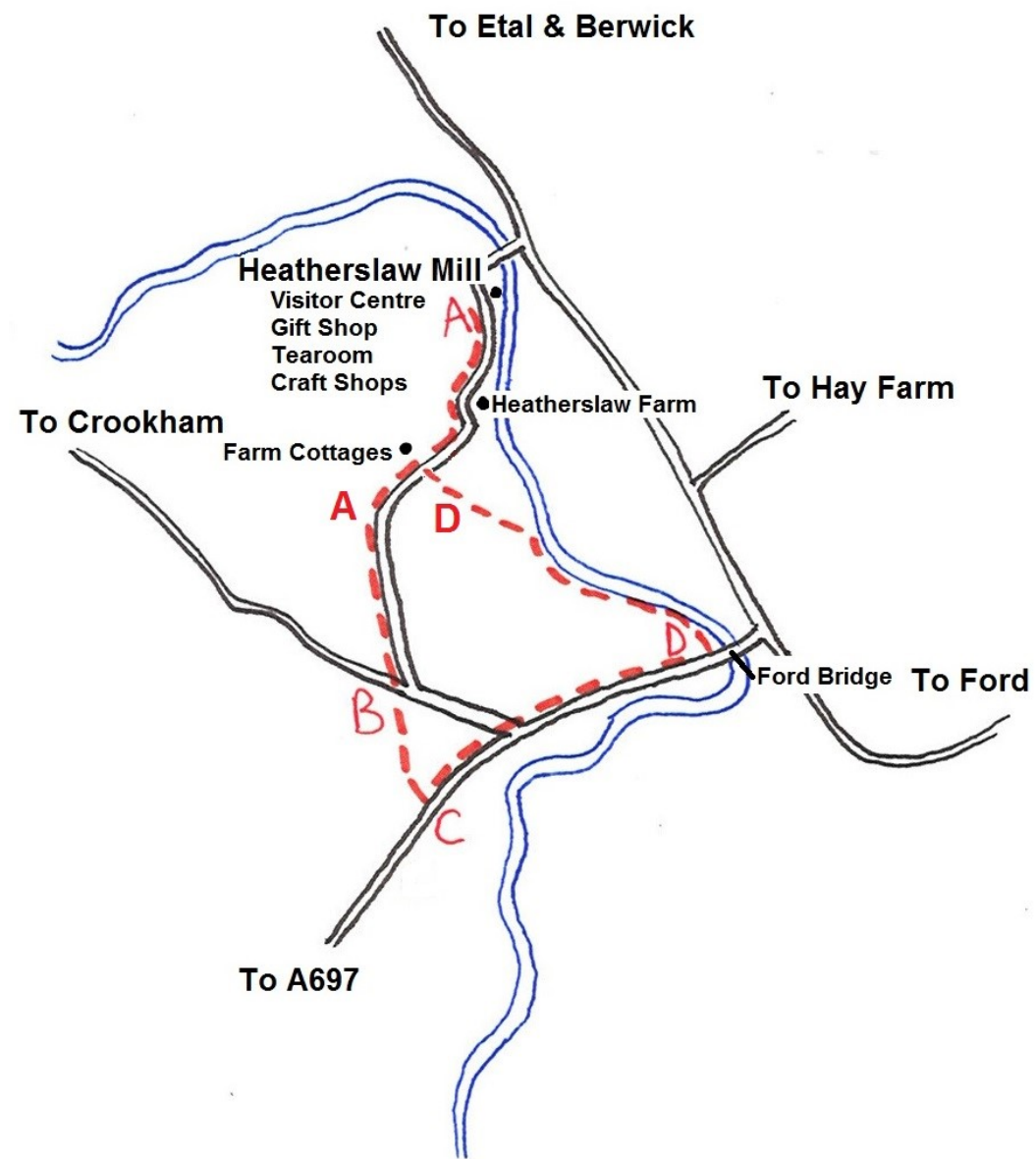
B. Cross the road and follow the signpost and waymarkers straight across the field.

C. Leave the field through the small wood and turn left onto the B6354 road.

D. Just before Ford bridge take the signposted footpath to the left which runs alongside the River Till and then follow the waymarkers left along the hedge line then turning right towards the cottages.

Turn right and follow the road back to Heatherslaw Mill and Visitor Centre.
